The distance from Danbury to Mt. Airy is about thirty miles, while to Winston-Salem is only twenty-eight, but with present road conditions Mt. Airy is most accessible, especially to citizens, residing north and northwest of Danbury. Hence practically all the merchants in that section are now making Mt. Airy their trading point instead of the Twin-City.
