NOTICE OF ISSUING OF  
SUMMONS AND WAR-

In the above entitled cause it  
appearing to the court upon af-  
idavit filed that the defend-  
ants, Mrs. Louise Brown and  
husband Edward L. Brown,  
are non-residents of North Car-  
olina and cannot be found there-  
in, and that personal service  
of summons cannot be made  
upon them and that they are  
necessary parties to this ac-  
tion, or if they are residents  
of this State they keep them-  
selves concealed therein to  
avoid the service of summons;  
and that the plaintiff has a  
good cause of action against  
the defendants, to-wit: breach  
of contract made and entered  
into between plaintiff and de-  
fendants on the first day of  
August, 1924, the amount of  
the balance due on same by the  
defendants to plaintiff being  
\$383.52, with interest from the  
1st day of August, 1924. That
