Winston-Salem, Oct. 21.—The Tobacco is selling at highly satisfactory prices in the Old Belt and the farmers are in a highly profitable position. They realize that the lack of moisture has caused the crop to be inferior in quality.

This market averaged for the week the sale yesterday of 583,300 pounds, \$20.04 per hundred pounds notwithstanding the market has had only 12 selling days this season. During the first of the season trade grades

have increased in abundance together with second qualities.
