Murphy, Jan. 16.—The Cherokee county court house here was destroyed by fire early today. The county records were taken out but it had not been determined whether they were damaged by fire and water.

The court house was a two-story structure facing Duke Park and built of brick, decorated with royal marble from the quarries in Cherokee county. It was built in 1891.

Volunteer firemen by a hard fight saved the Carnegie library and the county jail adjacent to the court house.
