

WAREHOUSEMEN ARE PROTESTING

Eastern Carolina Tobacco Men Want Market Opening Set For September First.

Wilson, N. C., June 30. The directors of the Eastern North Carolina Tobacco Warehousemen's Association, holding a called meeting here today with representatives of the mercantile, banking, farming and other business circles also in attendance, adopted resolutions strongly protesting against the date fixed for the opening of the tobacco warehouses of the eastern part of the State on September 7 by the tobacco association of the United States at its recent convention at Atlantic City, N. J.

The resolution directed to the sales committee of the national organization, which is the organization of the tobacco growers, to advise the opening date for the eastern Carolina market be changed from September 7 to September 1, declaring that the intervening six-week period would have a harmful effect upon business generally and the economic welfare of the farmers.
