

STOKES PEOPLE GO TO RALEIGH

Will Make Effort To Have C. B. Brody Released From the Penitentiary—Many Signed Petitions.

A number of Stokes citizens, accompanied by Attorney J. B. Humphreys, left today for Raleigh where a hearing will be had before State Pardon Commissioner Hugh Sikes in connection with an effort which is being made to have C. B. Brody, of Stokes, released from the State prison.

Petitions have been circulated throughout the county and signed by hundreds of citizens asking for the pardon of the Stokes man.

It will be recalled that Brody was sent up from Stokes more than a year ago on the charge of burning a store building in Walnut Cove. His friends do not believe him guilty and they have been sparing no efforts to secure his release.
