**SOUTHERN STATES
OWN MANY AUTOS**

Increase During First Half of 1926 Was Greatest In United States.

Raleigh, Sept. 23.—Southern States showed the greatest increase in automobile ownership during the first six months of 1926, according to reports of the United States Department of Agriculture received today, which discloses that 197,892 vehicles were registered in the United States during the first six months of 1926 as compared with 177,991 during the same period last year, representing an increase of 10.8 per cent.

The upward climb of the motor was led by Florida with an increase of 76.2 per cent over last year. Michigan was second with 24.3 per cent increase, Mississippi came third with 21.0 per cent. Ar-

kansas fourth with 19 per cent, and Oklahoma fifth with 16.7 per cent. Georgia registered an increase of nearly 15 per cent.

The gross receipts from registration fees, licenses and permits amounted to \$257,779,149 during the six months' period, of which amount, the report stated, the majority was devoted to road purposes.
