### Crushing Rock For Stokes Road Finished

The Chapel Hill Supply Co. after crushing six thousand tons of stone for use in hard-surfacing the Danbury-Walnut Cove highway, finished their work today and suspended operations. This is supposed to be enough stone to surface the road from Danbury to Meadows, a distance of three and one-tenth miles. The stone for hard-surfacing between Meadows and Walnut Cove will be shipped to the latter place and hauled from there.
