

Rev. O. E. Ward Will Continue Stokes Work

Winston-Salem, Nov. 7.—Rev. O. E. Ward, for the past four years pastor of Hanes Baptist church, yesterday announced that his work at Hanes would terminate January 1, giving as the reason for his action that he was giving a part of his time to congregations at Walnut Cove and Mt. Olive, Stokes county, and that the whole constituted more than he could handle well.

Rev. Mr. Ward took over the pastorate at Hanes four years ago after he had served various churches over Rockingham, Stokes and Forsyth counties. Since coming to Hanes that congregation has admitted approximately 225 members and now is a thriving body—the membership four years ago being much reduced in numbers.

Mission work has been encouraged recently at Hanes, one-fourth of all collections being turned into that channel. During the past year the church building has been remodeled and repainted inside and out and has had six Sunday school rooms added, all the gift of the P. H. Hanes Knitting Company. The Sunday school has shown considerable increase in interest and now has an enrollment of approximately 250 persons.

Rev. Mr. Ward will continue to live in Winston-Salem, driving to his pastoral work in Stokes county.

Lousy poultry will be unthrifty this winter. Some farmers are finding their flocks heavily infested at this time of the year.

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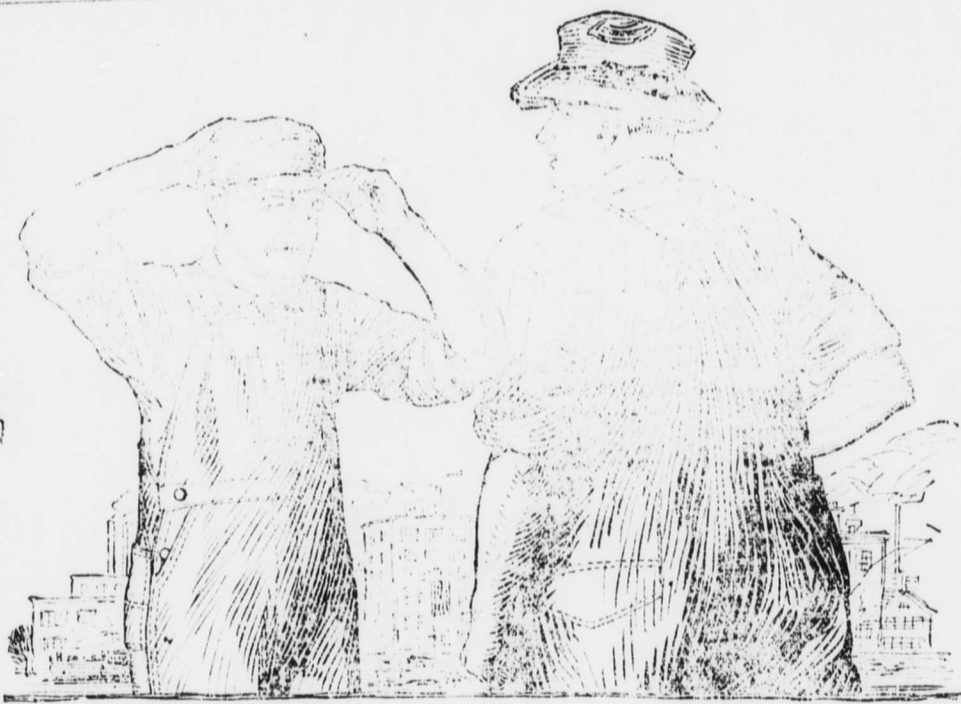
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
