This is sad but true. Recklessness seems to be part of the motoring code with millions of American drivers. And the inevitable result is that, every year, 25 or 30 thousand persons are killed and hundreds of thousands injured in preventable automobile accidents.

The tragic part of it is that the enormous annual waste of tively unnecessary. The un-preventable accident is rare as the dodo bird. Some is incompetent or reckless in the case of practically every collision, great or small, between motor cars.

The blame may be laid in two places. First is the apparent indifference of many motorists to the fundamentals of safety Second is the lack of strict licensing laws in most states to keep the incompetent and reckless off the road, and an accompanying lack of enforcement of modernized, common-sense traffic codes.




