

WILSON BEATS ALL TOBACCO MARKETS

Sold Eighty Million Pounds Before Closing For Christmas—Average \$13.92.

Wilson, Dec. 20.—Sales on the local tobacco market passed the 80,000,000-pound mark prior to the markets closing for the Christmas holidays, official sales figures announced today revealed.

The report of Bennet Hooks, supervisor of sales, showed that 80,453,966 pounds of weed had been sold off the floors of the nine warehouses prior to the suspension of sales yesterday. Purchasers paid growers of the lead \$11,197,309.19, for an average of \$13.92 per 100 pounds.

Sales the closing day totaled 643,660 pounds, for which \$75,041.18 was paid.

FARMERS TO MEET NEXT MONDAY

Machinery Being Formed To Dispense Relief to Farmers — Loans to Be Available Soon.

Dean Schaub, of Raleigh, accompanied by County Agent Trevathan and Paul Fulton of Walnut Cove, visited the Reporter office today, making tentative plans for securing loans for Stokes county drouth-hit farmers. Dean Schaub is at the head of the State organization for handling North Carolina's quota of the \$45,000,000 being appropriated by Congress for agricultural relief. Paul Fulton, J. R. Forest and H. G. Johnson have been named by County Agent Trevathan a committee for Stokes. This trio will pass on all applications for loans to Stokes farmers. It is possible that sub-committees will be named in the townships.

A meeting has been called by County Agent Trevathan at Danbury next Monday at which definite arrangements will be made to carry out the measures for relief.

It is learned that 2,500 farmers will ask for loans in Stokes. The only security required will be crop liens. The money must be used only for fertilizer, feed stuffs and gas and oil.
