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Independent Political Units.

Redress for the ills that beset society can best be obtained through the medium of one of the two great political parties.

Independent political units, or sporadic uprisings of unimportant groups of recalcitrant voters who imagine themselves to hold the balance of power, do not usually result seriously. Tobacco Crop Cut

Reports of farmers from adjoining counties to Forsyth indicate a substantial decrease in tobacco acreage in all the tobacco counties of the old belt.

The action of the federal loan committees in declining to approve applications for loans for those farmers who are unwilling to reduce their acreage, has had the effect of eliminating all chances for the usual heavy production. Coupled with this fact is the unfavorable condition for plants in many sections, owing to cold snaps, insects, disease, etc.

Farmers will hardly ever voluntarily reduce their tobacco acreage. But this year they are compelled to curtail, or do without help from the government.

Prices, which depend upon the law of supply and demand, should be better next fall, unless the depression so seriously lessens the demand for tobacco products as to neutralize the advantages obtained from a short crop.
