ON THE ROAD TO HANGING ROCK

IDENTIFYING FAMILIAR PLACES ON THE TRAIL - CHESTNUT COVE, LICK HOLLOW AND **GRASSY GAP ARE THE NAMES** OF THE DEPRESSIONS BL TWEEN THE THREE PEAKS.

Mr. L. J. Young, who is one the oldest citizens of the county and probably better acquainted with the mountain than any othe person of this section, gives the R. porter some information relative t the identity of certain points of ir terest on the road now being constructed to Hanging Rock.

From Danbury westward, there are three prominent peaks on th which have been called b some persons the "Three Sisters." Beyond the first peak, the gap of depression is well known as Ches nut Cove, and named by others a Orchard Gap.

Beyond the second peak, the sal is known as Lick Hollow, this being the place where deer often came to lick salt or eat moss from the many rocks in that vicinity.

Behind the third or last peak, is a flat meadow-like area which has always been designated as "Grassy "Gap."

It is reported here that through minunderstanding signs have beet erected in the gap beyond the set plak

After passing Grassy Gap, or the third peak, the route takes a slight incline on to the cliffs at the end of the ridge, and the precipice is known as Hanging Rock.
