**WILL CONTEST WITH R. B. HUTCHERSON FOR MEMBERSHIP ON BOARD OF EDUCATION — FOUR NAMES TO BE ON TICKET TO BE VOTED JUNE 30.**

R. E. L. Francis, of Francisco, who was third high man in the late primary for member board of education, has entered his name for the June 30 run-off.

In the primary of June 2 J. R. Forrest, of the old board, received 1128 votes, which entitled him to the nomination for membership on the board; R. B. Hutcherson, also of the old board, got 1037 while R. E. L. Francis received 921. Thus Francis was entitled to ask for a second primary.

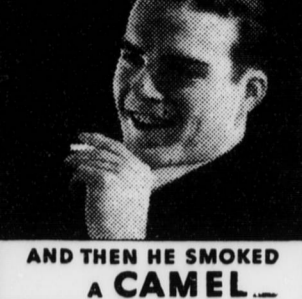
## Solicitor Graves Shows Improvement
