KIRBY'S STOKES FARM NEWS.

Plans for surveying Stokes wheat fields on contracted farms may own both farms and sign both contracts does not alter this arrangement.

The growing of more than the allotted acres of tobacco on any farm will invite trouble and expense to both the land owner and the tenant. Men are expected to reduce their tobacco acreage in accordance with the contract and each land owner is responsible for seeing that this is done on all the land either owned or controlled by him.

A New Administrative Ruling Regarding Rented Acres.

A new administrative ruling was announced on June 9th regarding the use of the rented acres on the farms of signing tobacco growers. This ruling will be of special interest to the Stokes farmers. Under this new ruling tobacco growers are permitted to grow and harvest hay and forage crops other than corn and grain sorghums on rented acres and it is not required that any part of the rented or contracted acres be left idle.

Reports Show Farmers Observing Contracts.

Numerous reports from various sections of the county show that farmers as a whole are observing the terms of the tobacco contract and are living up to the requirements of the AAA. Every effort is being made to keep growers informed so that everyone may know what is expected of him in complying fully with the requirements of the contract.

There seems to be some misunderstanding regarding the transfer of allotted acreage from one farm to another. The transfer of allotment from one farm to another can be made only where both farms are covered by the same contract. That one man
