### BAILEY PREDICTS NEW TOBACCO BILL

THE TOBACCO STATES TO ENTER INTO COMPACTS TO CONTROL THE CROP — STOKES FARMERS WILL CO-OPERATE.

Senator J. W. Bailey, who spent the week-end home at Raleigh from Washington, says the new tobacco compact bill will have easy sailing in Congress.

"The senate is in a position to consider the bill immediately and I anticipate nothing to interrupt its progress through the senate or the house," he said.

"The bill is simply a measure giving force and authority to the concert of the several states involved to meet their own problem."

The legislation is sought to permit the flue-cured tobacco states—Virginia, the Carolinas, and Georgia—to enter into compacts to control acreage.

Bailey said he would give Governor Ehringhaus "every co-operation" in his appeal to President Roosevelt for a \$50,000,000 allotment for tobacco areas under the new soil conservation program.

The farmers of Stokes county are very anxious to see the new tobacco legislation take shape, and will co-operate thoroughly with the plans in hand.

Something the school books don't tell about Arcadia, Florida, is that it is the home of one of the South's unique industries—the raising of rattlesnakes. Miss Reece's father, by the way publishes the weekly *Arcadian*. What turned our attention to Arcadia this week was the fact that although there are 17 towns called Arcadia the first farmer living in one to receive a Certificate of Award from the Arcadian Nitrate people is Mr. Clarke Brown of Arcadia, Florida. This certificate is given to farmers who conduct outstanding demonstrations with this Southern soda and thereby demonstrate their interest in the welfare of the South. The idea was originated by Dr. Charles H. Herby's plea of "Southern fertilizers for the Southern farmer."
