

Give The Devil His Dues, And Be As Fair To The Sales Tax

pay the sales tax in the proportion to the prices which he pays for purchases. If the poor man buys a cheap thing, he pays a small sales tax. If the rich person buys a costly thing, he pays a larger sales tax.

When the legislature repealed the ad valorem tax on real estate, thus benefiting the rich man by freeing his real estate, it laid a heavy income tax on the rich man and on the corporations, and a heavier franchise tax on the corporations.

Thus was the balance kept true.

Why is the sales tax so unpopular and why is it so odious in the eyes of the common people?

First, because it is an ever-present visible tax on everything we buy. Second, because the common people, not thoroughly understanding its applications, are misled by designing or misinformed politicians who hope to ride into office on their prejudices and fears, who juggle its figures and hoodwink and delude the people into believing it an intolerable evil.

THE SALES TAX NOT A NEW TAX

Have we not heretofore paid the sales tax without knowing it, it being levied indirectly on the things we bought?

You are right—but it is now required under the processes of our fiscal policies to be specifically and directly levied, and named the "sales tax."

Taxes must be paid as long as the expenses of government continue. We may disguise them in other schedules, or we may honestly come out with them into the open.

But for the friendly sales tax, the little man on his home must be taxed ad valorem again.

But for the beneficent sales tax, the farmer on his land must come back to the distressful burden of ad valorem taxation.

But for the convenient sales tax the teachers of North Carolina would certainly go on half-pay, while the doors of a thousand school houses would be closed months earlier while hundreds of State employes would be without jobs.

But for the saving grace of the sales tax the credit and honor of our State government must have trailed in the dust, and the sacred obligations of the commonwealth have been dishonored.

The sales tax is an odious tax, as all taxes are, but it is a fair tax, as it is levied justly on all persons alike—both rich and poor.
