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Letter of Appreciation And Thanks From Prof. Ramey

Danbury, N. C. May 18, 1936.

Mr. N. E. Pepper Dear Editor:

Please give me space in your valuable paper, The Danbury Reporter, to express my appreciation to the people of Danbury and the surrounding territory as well as to the workers who have cooperated so beautifully with us during the school year which is coming to a close.

First I should like to express my deepest appreciation of our efficient, patient, understanding county superintendent, Professor J. C. Carson. This being my first year to teach in Stokes county would naturally make some lasting impressions on my mind. May I mention two of these outstanding impressions?

One was the way in which Supt. Carson recognized the Bible and God in all of our teachers' meetings. Not one meeting was held without devoting a portion of time to reading and prayer. This was, as we all know, the spirit which permeated our "fore-fathers" who established our government and schools upon Christian principles.

The second was the prevailing continuously prevailed among the noble teaching force of Stokes county.

Then please allow me to express my heart-felt gratitude to the fine people of Danbury and to the noble, loyal people of the rural community whose children have come under my humble supervision this year. The people

all showed their true loyalty when they plowed through deep snows and cutting cold both by bus and on foot. The boys and girls of this school have endeared themselves to us to such an extent that we feel that in a sense they belong to us. We have tried hard, in our feeble way, to develop the fine characteristics and splendid personalities which we could see lying just beneath the surface, hidden by a little self-consciousness and timidity, in the youth of our school.

Too, concerning our able teaching force of Danbury school, who have labored co-operatively with us, we have carried on together. Sometimes we were happy in seeing the unfolding of personal character in the finer things of life, and with common consent gave our approval. Again we sorrowed together because of our inability with our present supply of suitable books and equipment to share in helping the pupils carry out their high purposes.

But this brings me to say here that words are inadequate to convey our appreciation to Supt. Carson and to every man from the most skilled workman to the most humble man who with his pick and shovel has helped to make possible the modern convenience for the school. The installation of up-to-date steam heat, water system, and sewage disposal, is sufficient to grace any home or public building in this section. So many have contributed to this part of the good work that it is impossible to mention all separately. However, it is enough to say to school officials, parents, workers, teachers

NOTICE Dog Owners! All dogs must be vaccinated before July 1, 1936. The law very specifically requires vaccination against rabies. Every dog over six months old must be vaccinated. The fee is 50 cents, and will be credited on dog tax upon presentation of certificate of vaccination signed by the inspector appointed by the board of county commissioners in the particular township in which he was appointed to serve. Any certificate by any party or parties other than those appointed by the board of commissioners of Stokes county will not be accepted by the tax collector as credit on taxes.
