ODELL BULLEN DIES AT STUART

ACCIDENT ON THE HIGH-WAY NEAR NORTH CARO-LINA LINE SATURDAY NIGHT IN WHICH STOKES BOY IS FATALLY INJURED - VIRGINIA MAN IN PAT-RICK JAIL CHARGED WITH MANSLAUGHTER - COLO-NEL BULLEN PAINFULLY

Odell Bullen, 24 years of age, son of Mody Bullin, of Lawsonville, and brother of Ernest Bullen, of Danbury, is dead.

He passed in a Stuart, Va., hospital Sunday evening after being injured in a crash near the North Carolina line, a few miles South of Stuart Saturday night. His head was crushed and he sustained other serious injuries.
