TOBACCO PLANTERS SAY

three propositions: (1) Split precincts so that no precinct, based on the last election, should contain more than a reasonable number of votes. He had a list of more than 100 precincts in which 1,000 to 2,500 votes were cast in 1936. (2) Require precinct judges of the minority party to send ballots return to county chairmen of the minority party; and (3) require county election board chairmen to notify county party chairmen in writing on the day of receipt the name and address of each applicant for an absentee ballot.

Lucas Heads State Board Of Elections

Raleigh, Feb. 7.—The State Board of Elections chose W. A. Lucas of Wilson as its chairman today and announced it would meet March 26 to appoint county election boards.

George Mitchell of Fayetteville, who served as secretary of the board some years ago, was elected secretary. He and Lucas were chosen unanimously, the chairman by recommendation of Governor Hoey.

secretary since the present form of State Board was set up in 1925, was unanimously chosen to continue in the job.

Associate Justice J. Wallace Winborne of the supreme court administered the oath of office to Lucas McNeil and J. O. Bell of Hendersonville, the Democratic members of the new board, and Warren V. Hall of Charlotte and Adrian S. Mitchell of Winton, the Republican members. Mitchell is the only person to serve on the board each year since it was established in 1925.
