HOMICIDE AT SANDY RIDGE

HENRY BROWN DIES FROM A BLOW ON THE HEAD BY ROCK — TWO RICHARDSON BOYS IN JAIL CHARGED WITH THE CRIME.

Henry Brown, Sandy young man, aged 37, died in a Leaksville hospital Friday morning from injuries received in fight at his brother's O. T. Brown's, filling station two or three miles north of Sandy Ridge, Thursday night.

John Richardson, aged 25, and Jamie Richardson, aged 16, his brother, are in Danbury jail to await hearing charged with the death of Brown. These men were arrested by Stokes officers soon after the killing.

The Richardsons-so it is reported to officers-got into general row with several people at the filling station, during which rocks were thrown.
