## BYRD-MCDONALD CASE CONTINUED

ALLEGED MURDERERS OF TAYLOR WILL NOT BE TRIED THIS TERM—JUDGE BIVENS' COURT IS DISPOSING OF MANY ACTIONS—RECORD TO NOON THURSDAY.

The spring criminal term of Stokes Superior Court is in session this week presided over by Judge E. C. Bivens of Surry. Solicitor Allen Gwyn is prosecuting for the State.

The murder indictment against Byrd and McDonald, the white man and the negro charged with killing Taylor on the Hollow road near Walnut Cove, has been continued until the July term of criminal court.
