CHAIRMAN BAILEY Calls Stokes Democrats to Organize. COUNTY CONVENTION AT DANBURY Saturday, May 14, 1938

To The Democrats of Stokes County:

Saturday, May 7th, at 2 P. M., is the time for holding our precinct meetings. Saturday, May 14th, at 11 A. M., is the time for holding our County Convention at Danbury. Thursday, May 19th, at noon, our State Convention will be held at Raleigh.

The precinct meeting shall transact the following business:

(1) Elect the precinct committee of five active Democrats at least one of whom shall be a woman. The Committee so elected shall immediately elect a chairman and Vice-Chairman, one of whom shall be a woman.

(2) Elect delegates to the County Convention. The Chairman of the precinct committee meeting shall certify to the County Chairman the name and address of the precinct committeemen, and of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman elected as above provided, and of the names of the delegates to the County Convention, all prior to the time of the convening of said convention.

The County Executive Committee made up of the Chairman of the precinct committees in the County will meet on the day of the County convention, and elect a chairman, and a Vice-Chairman of the County Executive Committee. The Vice-Chairman shall be a woman. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman need not be members of the Committee.

Please carry out the above instructions from our State Chairman, which is according to the State plan of organization.
