

LET TRUTH PREVAIL



A number of people have advised me that an ardent supporter of Mr. A. H. Gwyn for Judge has been circulating the report that I stated in a meeting of the Bar of Rockingham County that I would not be a candidate for Judge in the coming primary.

This report is absolutely false and it could only be circulated for the purpose of injuring me with the voters.

The following statement of Mr. H. R. Scott, President of the Rockingham County Bar who presided at the meeting in question, and of Mr. E. H. Wrenn, Secretary, will show the facts:

NORTH CAROLINA, ROCKINGHAM COUNTY.

We, the undersigned, President and Secretary of the Rockingham County Bar Association, hereby certify the following to be true:

At a regular meeting of the Bar of Rockingham County, held at Wentworth, N. C., on March 30, 1937, Mr. P. W. Glidewell moved that the Bar by viva voce vote say whether the Bar for Rockingham County shall endorse or recommend any member of said Bar for Judge of the new District for appointment by the Governor. This motion was carried. A vote was taken by those present, on the names of Allen Gwyn and J. M. Sharpe. There were 23 of the 36 licensed attorneys of the County present. Before the vote was taken, Mr. Sharpe stated that since Mr. Gwyn was absent he would not vote and he did not. The vote showed 9 for Mr. Sharpe and 13 for Mr. Gwyn.

Immediately thereafter, Mr. Sharpe made a motion that the endorsement for Mr. Gwyn for appointment be made unanimous, but stated at the time he would be a candidate for Judge in the primaries following, at which time the law requiring a Judge to be nominated and elected in the General Election.

H. R. SCOTT, Pres. E. H. WRENN, Sec. This Oct. 15, 1937. Immediately after this meeting I notified the Governor that I was no longer an applicant for the appointment but that I would be a candidate in the June Primary. I also notified Mr. Gwyn and Mr. Bivens that in the June Primary I would oppose whomsoever the Governor appointed.

I then presented a petition for endorsement in the June Primary to the officials of the Bar of Rockingham County, Officers of the County, and members of the Democratic Executive Committee, and in August of 1937 I was endorsed, with a few exceptions by all of them, as well as by hundreds of other citizens.

I desired to be eminently fair to both Mr. Gwyn and Mr. Bivens. All I ask is that the truth prevail,
