17TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1933, at 12 O'CLOCK M., at the court house door in said county, sell at public auction to the highest bidder therefor the following described lands, situated in Bethania and Meadows Townships, Forsyth and Stokes Counties, respectively, comprising 225.9 acres, more or less, and bounded and described as follows:

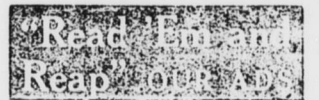
