"BOOKMOBILE" STARTS NOV. 8

SPONSORED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND FINANCED BY WPA.

On November 8, 1939, a WPA "Bookmobile", carrying books that any reader might want, will begin its travels over Stokes county. This bookmobile is operated by WPA and owned by the Federal agency. The Stokes County Board of Education is sponsoring this work and cooperating in every possible way to make it a success and give anyone in the county a chance to take advantage of the opportunity offered by this bookmobile. The same rounds will be made every two weeks and books can be exchanged or renewed for another two weeks.
