

**Mrs. Dalton Explains The Workings of The NYA Program**

I believe the people in Stokes county will be interested in knowing something of the NYA program in the county.

On January 1st I was appointed NYA Supervisor for the county. The State office in Raleigh gave us four projects with which to begin the program, A Clerical Helpers Project, A Lunch Room Helpers Project, A Builders Repair Helpers Project and a Home Makers Project. This last project is not in operation due to the need for machines, other equipment, coal for warmth, etc. Machines however have been requisitioned from Raleigh and we hope to have this project going at an early date.

The other three projects are in operation, and although we have only been going one month as I write this, forty six young people will receive \$14.00 each for seventy hours work during the month of January, with just a very few exceptions, young people who have never drawn a pay check before.

This \$644.00 aside from being of benefit to the recipients will mostly be spent in the county, and so will benefit our merchants and others.

This money was brought into the county without one bit of expense to the county, other than the Board of County Commissioners have very generously furnished me with a desk, a typewriter and other smaller equipment and Miss Ella Downing, Superintendent of Public Welfare, has very graciously given me office space in the department of public welfare.

The State NYA department has set aside \$14,862.80 for the operation of these four projects, and we hope and expect that before this amount is expended that many more thousands will have been earmarked for Stokes county.

NYA is not a charity organization, and it is not in any way connected with WPA. It is just what its name implies, A National Youth Administration to give training and employment to boys and girls between the ages of eighteen and twenty-five who need training and employment until they can find private jobs.

I want to thank Mr. J. C. Carson, county superintendent of Education, the Board of County Commissioners, Miss Downing and others for their interest and cooperation in helping us launch this program.

We earnestly invite all those interested who would like details of the program to call on us, at our office in the department of public welfare, in Danbury.
