Mrs. Dalton Explains The Workings of The **NYA** Program

I believe the people in Stokes county will be interested in knowing something of the NYA program in the county.

On January 1st I was appointed NYA Supervisor for the county. The State office in Raleigh gave us four projects with which to begin the program, A Clerical Helpers Project, A Lunch Room Helpers Project, A Builders Repair Helpers Project and a Home Makers Project. This last project is not in operation due to the need for machines, other equipment, coal for warmth, etc. Machines however have been requisitioned from Raleigh and we hope to have this project going at an early date.

The other three projects are in operation, and although we have only been going one month as I write this, forty six young pec ple will receive \$14.00 each for seventy hours work during the month of January, with just a very few exceptions, young people who have never drawn a pay check before.

This \$644.00 aside from being of benefit to the recipients will mostly be spent in the county, and so will benefit our merchants and others.
