**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN**

That the List Takers for their respective townships, Stokes county, will sit at the places named below at the hours named below and at other times at the Residence of the List Takers from the 1st day of January, to the 8th day of February, 1941, at which places and dates all property owners and tax payers are required to return to their respective List Takers for taxation for the year 1941. All Real Estate, Personal Property, Poll and Dogs, which each one shall own on the first day of January, 1941, or shall be required to give in.

All male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 are required to list their polls.

PERSONS WHO SHALL HAVE BEEN EXEMPTED FROM THE PAYMENT OF POLL TAX will, when they come to list, be required to exhibit a certificate of such exemption from the Clerk of the County Commissioners.

ALL PERSONS WHO ARE LIABLE FOR A POLL TAX AND FAIL TO GIVE THEMSELVES IN, and all who own property and fail to list it, will be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction fined or imprisoned.

DOGS MUST BE LISTED—the State Law requires every dog to be listed. Persons failing or refusing to list dogs are guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined \$50.00 or imprisoned 30 days. Section 402 specifies that the OWNER OF THE HOME (or lessee of such owner) shall be responsible for listing of any dog belonging to any members of his family, and for any dog found on his place. DOGS MUST BE LISTED.

ALL PERSONS FAILING TO LIST BEFORE THE LIST TAKERS WILL BE CHARGED A FEE OF \$1.00.

FAILURE TO LIST OR ATTEMPT to evade just taxation will subject taxpayer to a specific penalty of 25 per cent. of Total Tax and to such other penalties as prescribed by law.

LIST WITH YOUR LIST TAKER BEFORE FEBRUARY 8TH, 1941, AND SAVE PENALTY.

NO ONE CAN LIST WITH THE TAX OFFICIALS AT DANBURY. YOU MUST LIST WITH YOUR LIST TAKER IN YOUR RESPECTIVE TOWNSHIP THIS YEAR.
