"AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$69,000 REFUNDING BONDS OF STOKES COUNTY.

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Stokes, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. That bonds of said County for the maximum aggregate amount of \$69,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the County Finance Act, as amended, for the purpose of refunding valid subsisting indebtedness of said County incurred for necessary expenses and evidenced by the following outstanding bonds, which bonds are redeemable at the option of the County on any semi-annual interest payment date prior to their maturity:

\$66,000 Road and Bridge Refunding Bonds dated December 1, 1935, payable December 1, 1952, consisting of 32-bonds of the denomination of \$500, numbered 1 to 8, 19 to 22, 33 to 40, 51 to 54 and 65 to 72, inclusive, and 25-bonds of the denomination of \$1000 numbered 14 to 18, 28 to 32, 46 to 50, 60 to 64 and 75 to 82, inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum and 25-bonds of the denomination of \$1000, numbered 9 to 13, 23 to 27, 41 to 45, 55 to 59 and 73 to 77, inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of 5 1-2 per cent. per annum.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds herein authorized when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. That a statement of the County debt has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.

Section 4. That this order shall take effect upon its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters.

"The foregoing order was finally passed on the 20th, day of October, 1941 and was first published on the 9th, day of October 1941, any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said order must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.

"AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$18,000 SCHOOL REFUNDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF STOKES

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Stokes, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. That bonds of said County for the maximum aggregate amount of \$18,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the County Finance Act, as amended, for the purpose of refunding valid subsisting indebtedness of said County which was incurred by said County as an administrative agency of the State for providing the uniform State system of schools for the six months' term, as required by the Constitution of North Carolina, which indebtedness is evidence by the following outstanding bonds of said County redeemable at the option of said County prior to their maturity on any semi-annual interest payment date:

\$18,000 School Refunding Bonds dated December 1, 1935, payable December 1, 1952 and consisting of 18-bonds of the denomination of \$1000, numbered 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 13, 14, 15 and 18, bearing interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum and numbered 1, 2, 6, 7, 11, 12, 16 and 17, bearing interest at the rate of 5 1-2 per cent. per annum.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds herein authorized when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. That a statement of the County debt has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.

Section 4. That this order shall take effect upon its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters.

AAA Urges Farmers To Apply Soil Builders To Receive Credit

Farmers are urged to apply AAA Limestone and superphosphate at the earliest possible date, certainly not later than October 31, in order to receive credit as a Soil Building Practice and to avoid a double deduction from the payment for the cost of this limestone.

A recent ruling from the Washington Office is to the effect that the seeding of Rye and other small grains, other than wheat, to be turned in the spring to qualify for the maximum tobacco payment has been extended to December 15. This time was extended

because of the extreme dry condition of the soil due to the drought, and any producer who expects to take advantage of this ruling should notify this office immediately.

This ruling, in the opinion of the committee, is most favorable for Stokes county because it will permit every producer to earn his maximum tobacco payment, where other wise he would be unable to do so and every farmer has not earned his maximum Soil Building Payment should take advantage of this ruling and advise his neighbors to do likewise.

Notice To Stokes Farmers Owning Cows

Many persons have often said

that Stokes county only had a relatively small number of cows, heifers and calves. Even if we did several years ago we have certainly changed our farming system now.
