DOPE FIEND **SLASHES WRIST** IN JAIL HERE

A. F. WYATT, BLUEFIELD, W. VA., MAN WITHOUT BOND IN TWO CHARGES

A. F.Wyatt, Buefield, W. Va., who has been in jail here for the past week on charges of shoplifting and shortchanging merchants at Walnut Cove, yesterday made an attempt to end his life by cutting his wrist with a razor blade. Deputy and Jailor Burke Smith says Wyatt is the worst victim of dope he has seen in his fifteen years experience at the jail.

The prisoners in the jail called for help upon discovering that the man was attempting suicide. Dr. R. H. Moorefield was summoned to the jail where he bandaged the wound and gave morphine which relieved the patient.
