STOKES TO HAVE LARGEST CALL July 10, 21st

BIGGEST CONTINGENT OF MEN YET INDUCTED TO LEAVE IN JULY.

The Stokes County Local Draft Board No. 1 reports that it will have its largest call since selective Service began, in July. The call will be filled with both white and colored men.

A contingent of colored men, the number of which will not be disclosed until a later date, will leave July 10. The white men will leave July 21.

Heretofore, draftees departed around 9:00 a. m. The board now notifies registrants that this quota will leave Danbury at 1:30 p. m. The men will be sent to Fort Bragg.

LAWSONVILLE BOY EVADES PHYSICAL EXAMINATION FOUR TIMES.
