

Tobacco Prices Highest In 23 Yrs.

FARMERS WELL PLEASED WITH SPLENDID AVERAGES RUNNING ABOVE 40 — STOKES CROP WILL BRING RECORD TOTAL.

The tobacco markets opened Monday with crowded warehouse floors and the highest prices since the bull year of 1919.

At Mount Airy, Winston-Salem, Madison, and other markets the averages, which are holding firm, are running around 43 to 45.

Farmers are best pleased for 23 years with their splendid averages.

The Stokes crop, much larger than the big year of 1919, will total more than 1919, and will probably be a record breaker.

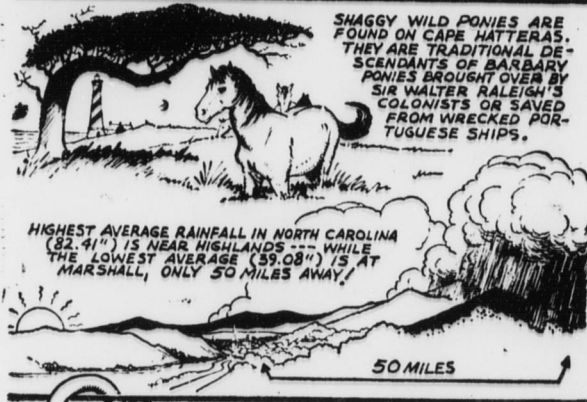
