

Teeman Priddy Is Promoted

Fort Custer, Michigan.—Teeman A. Priddy, Danbury, N. C., has been promoted to the rank of Pvt. 1st Class in the Medical Section here. His promotion was made upon the recommendation of his company commander in view of his demonstrated interest, initiative, and ability in the work assigned him.

Pfc. Priddy now ranks in Grade pay scale of the Army enlisted men under the recently revised promotion system. The seven pay scales are: Grade 1, master ser-

geant; Grade 2, first or technical sergeant; Grade 3, staff sergeant; Grade 4, sergeant; Grade 5, corporal; Grade 6, private first class; and Grade 7, private.

In the promotion system revision ranks of Technician 3rd Grade, Technician 4th Grade and Technician 5th Grade were created to increase the opportunity for promotion and at the same time simplify the Army pay system. Technicians rank below the non-commissioned officers of the same pay. Their chevrons carry a T below the center.

Four separate units are in training at Fort Custer. The Post Complement is responsible for the administration and supply of all

troops on the Post. The Recruit Reception Center receives, clothes, and assigns to Replacement Training Center all Michigan selectees.

The Second Army Special Troops are assorted units under the command of General Ben Lear who are in training for special duties such as tank destroyers, quartermaster, and engineers with the Second Army. The 94th Infantry Division is a triangular infantry combat division which will be activated and trained here:

AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$31,000 GENERAL REFUNDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF STOKES TO REFUND OUTSTANDING BONDS OF SAID COUNTY

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the county of Stokes, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. That pursuant to the County Finance Act of North Carolina, as amended, bonds of the county of Stokes of the aggregate principal amount of \$31,000 are hereby authorized to be issued for the purpose of refunding the principal amount of valid existing debt of said county incurred for necessary expenses and for special purposes within the meaning of the Constitution of North Carolina and evidenced by the following outstanding bonds: \$31,000 General Refunding Bonds, dated December 1, 1935, maturing December 1, 1952, bearing interest at the rate of 4 3/4 per cent. per annum, payable semiannually on June 1st and December 1st of each year, redeemable at par and accrued interest on any interest payment date prior to maturity, and consisting of 31 bonds of \$1,000 each numbered 1 to 7, 9 to 16, 18 to 25 and 27 to 34, all inclusive.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds herein authorized shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. That a statement of the county debt of the county of Stokes has been filed with the clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said county, and is open to public inspection.

Section 4. That this order shall take effect upon its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters.

The foregoing order was finally passed on the 21st day of September, 1942, and was first published on the 24th day of September, 1942. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said order must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.
