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CRIMINAL COURT **NEXT MONDAY**

Eighty-six Cases On Docket, One For Murder Charge - Nearly All Actions For Violation Of The Liquor Laws, Driving Drunk, Etc.

The regular fall term of criminla court convenes next Monday with Judge Allen H. Gwyn on the bench and Solicitor Ralph J. Scott prosecuting on behalf of the State.

Eighty-six cases are on the docket. There is one action, State vs. Joe Johnson, in which the charge is murder. Practically all the remaining cases are for violations of the liquor laws, manufacturing, transporting, driving drunk, etc. Thirteen are actions for cost in former terms. There are 7 larceny cases, 5 for reckless driving, two for non-support, one for conspiracy.

The criminal term will last several days, possibly a week.

Monday, October 19, the term for the trial of civil actions will begin.


