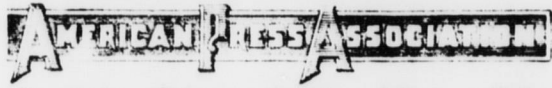

Hubert Merritt of King, killed in action.

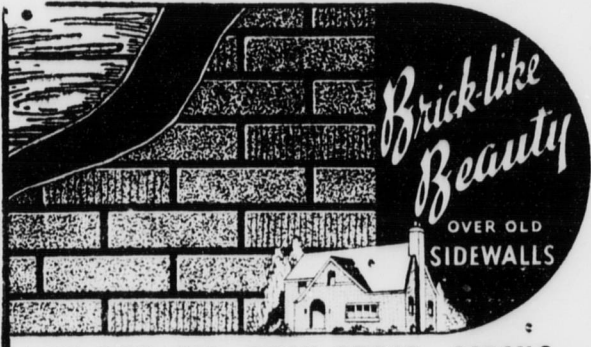
