He Jumped for Freedom. EDWARDS PLANT.—Considerable excitement was caused on the freight train last night after leaving Goldsboro. A prisoner by the name of Lynch was arrested some where below Goldsboro for illicit distilling and forgery, brought to Goldsboro and placed in the hands of ex-Sheriff Grantham, who started with him for Raleigh on the train and at 8:10 p. m. Before the train had gone three miles, the prisoner by some means eluded the vigilance of the officer, reached the door and jumped from the train, while going at the rate of about 15 miles per hour.

The Medical Society Considers the Hospital Question. At the regular meeting of the County Medical Society, on Monday night, it was represented that the plan of inaugurating a hospital for Durham, proposed some months since, had been a failure and that certain officers had recently been made looking to the opening of a hospital for the town.

Resolved, That we, as the Durham County Medical Society, form a Hospital Association, and that each member be appointed to examine eligible sites for location and report at a called meeting Tuesday night.
