CAPT. DAWSON'S FUNERAL. An Outpouring of the People-Some Details of the Murder.

A Charleston special to the Richmond Dispatch of yesterday says: "Capt. Dawson was buried this evening in St. Lawrence cemetery. The meral services were held at the Cathedral, Bishop Northrop officianing, assisted by Monsignor Quigley and Father Duffy. The church was ammed, all the city turning out to do honor to his memory. The funeral cortege was the longest seen in charteston for many years. As it na-sed through King street on its way to the cemetery, the street was ined with sympathetic lookers on, who, standing with bared heads in a driving rain, bore mute, but eloquent honorary list of pall-bearers was made up of the most eminent men in the city. The scene at the grave could not have been more pathetic. THE MURDERER EXCITED.
