NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all concerned, that the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, by virtue of the authority conferred upon him by the 3rd section of the act approved July 13th, 1866, has designated the following places in the 2nd Collection District of the State of North Carolina, as places where an Assessor or an Assistant Assessor and a Collector or Deputy Collector will be located on the days respectively named, for the purpose of weighing and appropriately marking, under the Internal Revenue Laws, any Cotton which may be brought to those several places from the places where the same was produced, in the same district, viz: Monday and Saturday, Rocky Mount; Monday, Wednesday and Friday, Tarboro; Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, Greenville. Tuesday and Friday, Wilson. Wednesday and Thursday, Goldsboro'. Continuously, Wilmington, Newbern and Beaufort. Cotton produced in this District may go to either of the above named places, as may best suit the convenience of the producer or holder, without reference to the particular part of the District in which it is produced.
