National Capital Matters.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 22, 1894. A quorum of the cabinet has been in Washington this week, but not all at one time. Secretary Smith was only in town three days and Secretary Lamont has just arrived.

Senator Faulkner has decided that he can be of more benefit to the party by giving his undivided attention to managing the Congressional campaign committee, of which he is chairman.

Although no official announcement has been made to that effect, and none is expected, it has been understood for some time that Treasury officials regarded women a failure as high grade clerks in that department.

One of the best campaign documents sent out by the Democratic Campaign Committee is a list of the new enterprises inaugurated and of old ones which have resumed work since the new tariff became a law.
