To stimulate those bearing this burden, allow the writer to mention a curious coincident between this institution and that called tha Greenwich Academy, a similar conference school in East Greenwich, Rhode Island, the home of General Nat, Greene, our city's name sake.

Through extensive repairs, in 1873, an old debt and much mismanagement, at the great panic and general depreciation of property this school found itself under a debt of \$40,-
