TELEGRAPHIC SUMMARY. YELLOW FEVER

Laces! News From the Plague-Stricken District.

Jacksonville, Sept. 25 .- The weather has cleared off and is cool and pleasant. The declaration of a yellow fever epidemic in Fernandina opens the quarantine of that place. and it is expected that more than two thousand colored people will flock here seeking free food, and prompt steps will be taken to guard this city against an influx of new material for fever, by increasing the sanitary police guarding the ontskirts. About thirty new cases have been reported this morning. There are no official reports of deaths, but among them is known to be John L. Burch, one of the board of public works. The executive committee of the sanitary as sociation this morning took steps to more stringently guard against

frauds and imposition. Jackson, Miss., Sept. 25 - There were no deaths or new cases of yel low fever here since Sunday morn ing. The health authorities are endeavoring to establish a refuge camp near the city and the Howard Association will furnish supplies only to such as go there.




