THE WRONG CAR ROBBED

BANDITS HOLD UP A BALTIMORE AND OHIO EXPRESS TRAIN. TWO MAIL CARS BLOWN OPEN.

Chicago, July 31.—The Baltimore and Ohio passenger train from the east due to arrive in the Grand Central depot (Chicago) at 9 o'clock tonight, was held up by five masked men at 3 o'clock between Edgewater and Grand Calumet Heights, Ind., thirty-one miles from Chicago.

The train was running at a high rate of speed as it passed Calumet Heights, and immediately after passing out of the city limits, the robbers, who were armed with revolvers and shotguns, jumped into the cab and held the engineer and fireman at bay.

After mounting into the cab of the engine the robbers, covering the engineer and fireman with their revolvers, held them fast down and took back the length of the train. They ordered the engineer to stop the train at a point where the train was about a mile from the city.
