BUFFALO LAYS ASIDE HER EXPOSITION DECORATIONS.

IN MEMORY OF DEAD PRESIDENT

The City is Draped and Mourning Badges Are Worn by All-Remains Lying in State in the City Hall Viewed by Thousands-Short Service at the Milburn House for Family and Friends Before Removal to the City

Buffalo, N. Y., September 15.—Buffao today became a city of mourning. The gray and flaming decorations of the Pan-American exposition gave way to the symbol of sorrow. The black drapery of the city's streets muffled the crepe appeared on every sleeve. The sorrow was everywhere apparent. In th morning a simple service took place at the residence on Delaware avenue where the martyred president died. A health. hymn was sung and a prayer was offered over the dead body. That was all. Only the immediate family and the friends and political assistants of the late president were present. The scene there was pathtle in the extreme.
