

COLUMBIA AGAIN VICTOR DEFEATS SHAMROCK IN LATTER'S OWN KIND OF BREEZE.

FAIR TEST OF THE TWO BOATS

Columbia Crosses Starting Line Over a Minute Behind Shamrock - Gains Twenty-Two Seconds on First Leg Catches Up With Shamrock on Second and Sails Away From Her on Home Stretch - Wins by Over Three Minutes - Third Race Today.

New York, October 3.—In a glorious half-hour breeze which blew the two racing yachts across the water in a fair test of their respective merits, Columbia today beat Watson's British schooner over a triangular course of thirty miles by 2 minutes and 52 seconds after the start.

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At the opening of court Lieutenant Doyle resumed his testimony. He was asked by the committee whether the Brooklyn had engaged in any bombardment during the month of July, 1898.

Judge Advocate Lemly objected, but Admiral Dewey said that if the question was confined to the Brooklyn he would not object. The witness testified that he had not seen any smoke coming from the harbor over Coos Bay.

They began to fire again and again. It was necessary then, after loading the guns a second time to turn the turret around the roof."
