Mr. E. W. Myers.

Answering your inquiry as to the attitude of this Company relative to the call of the President for volunteers to join the engineering and coast defence companies, I desire to report that this Company stands unequivocally committed to the policy of backing up the President in every way within its power, and should any of our young men volunteer for the defence of their country, they shall not lose the places that they vacate temporarily for service in defence of the government, but their places shall be held open for them whenever they shall return. And instead of losing casts by reason of volunteering, they shall be enhanced in their standing and in the appreciation of this Company.
