

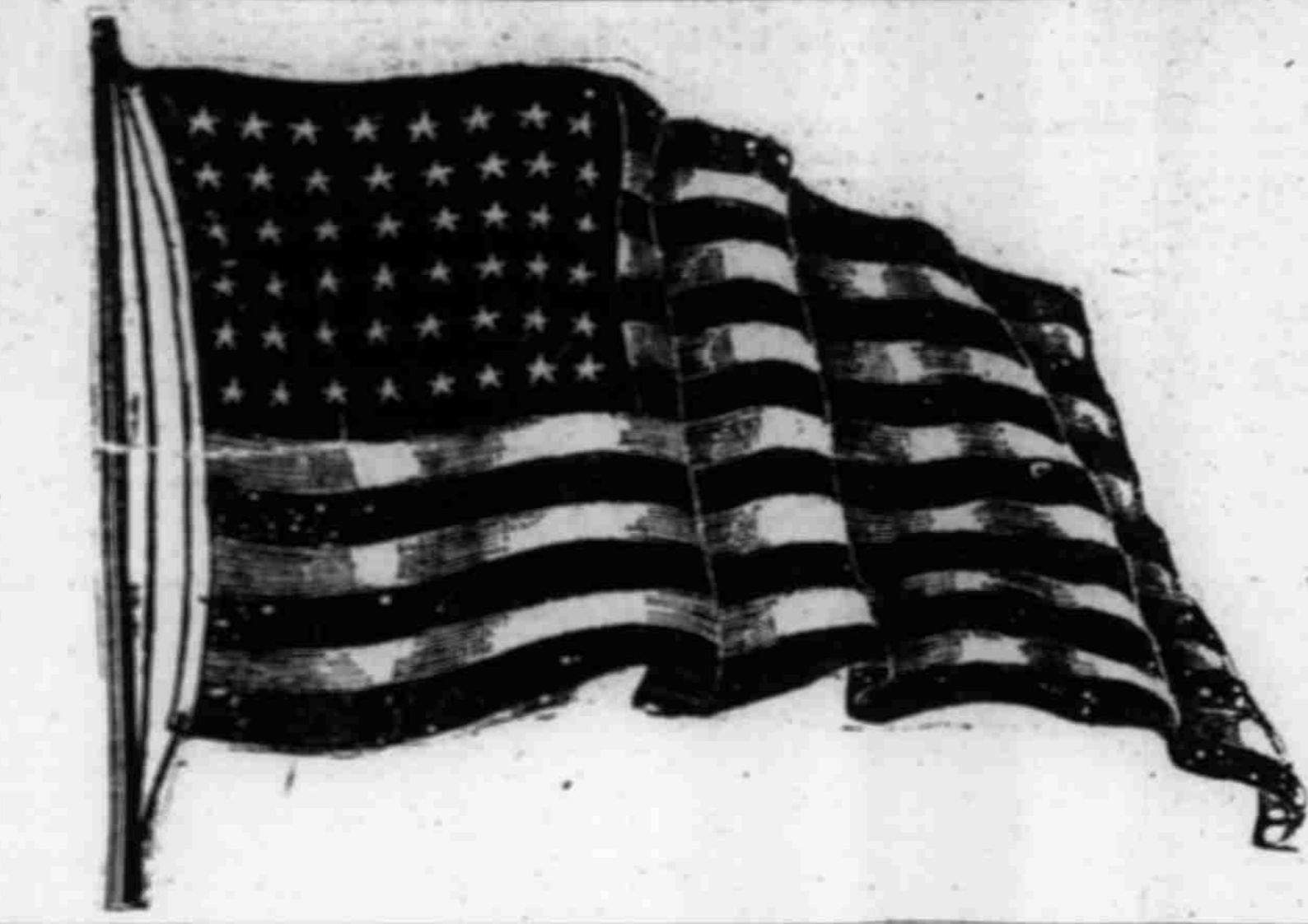

FLORIDA WOMEN GIVE PARK.

Mrs. Mary K. Sherman, chairman of the department of conversation, General Federation of Women's Clubs, reports the establishment of a park by the women of Florida for the preservation of natural resources...

THE BLUFF WAS CALLED.

(Raleigh Times.) The Federation of Women's clubs in North Carolina, an organization of nearly 6,000 among the most intelligent and influential women in the state, have repeatedly passed resolutions requesting recognition by appointments on the boards of several state institutions...

The park is in the southeastern peninsula of Florida, the Everglade region. By reason of its location it has never been overrun by fire and it represents in its vegetation the growth of centuries...

It is true that there are very few girls at the University or at the A. and E. but women raised all the boys sent to those institutions and their care should not have stopped short of some representation among the trustees. In the state penitentiary there are 30 men to every woman, but if even one woman had been on the board we would have been spared the sickening details brought out in the recent legislative investigation of that institution...

The chairman of Royal Palm State park is Mrs. John Gifford, who 20 years ago introduced the resolution in the general federation creating the conservation department. The movement for the park was begun in 1906. In 1915, the state legislature granted the federation 950 acres for park purposes and Mrs. Frazier added to this an endowment of 950 acres. The federation, while working for a state appropriation for caring for the park, is defraying the expenses by a popular dime subscription movement.

CHILDREN SING THEIR PATRIOTISM.

The Norfolk Virginian-Pilot says: The lessons of patriotism taught in Norfolk's public schools and inculcated in the minds and hearts of the youth of the city found expression yesterday afternoon in flag ceremonies and singing in the City Hall square by several hundred pupils of the schools. The exercises were preliminary to the patriotic demonstration in the armory hall last night. City Hall square and the streets surrounding it were packed with people...

WOMAN PLANTER LEADS.

The first woman in the Philippines to take the lead in agricultural pursuits in her district is Mrs. Theodora Zavilla, in Santa Rosa Laguna, says the Times. Officials of the Bureau of Agriculture speak highly of the efforts of Mrs. Zavilla to improve agricultural operations in her district, stating that she has set an example which ought to be followed by all the farmers in the islands. Report of the activities of the woman farmer was received by the director of agriculture from Inspector McCarthy of the station in Santa Cruz Laguna. He stated that Mrs. Zavilla is now the foremost farmer in Santa Rosa district. She received instruction in seed selection from Inspector McCarthy, and then she trained 15 of her own men whom she accompanied to the fields and assisted personally in selecting the rice seed for the next season's planting...

OKLAHOMA IN FRONT RANK.

Quite in keeping with the day was the action of the Oklahoma legislature, March 17, when the Senate unanimously concurred with the House to submit to the voters at the next general election a bill giving men and women full, equal suffrage. "This was a fine way to celebrate St. Patrick's Day," writes a correspondent, "we all know St. Patrick was a gentleman of fortune and refinement. Oklahoma may share his fortune in the great advantage she will get from advertising, and the jolly saint's renown will come from the fame that attaches to all the states which have bravely scotched the snakes of political subjection and conventional unfairness to women. Here's to Oklahoma go brag, alanna, ashore and all the other blessings that follow liberty."

ARKANSAS A MODEL.

An Arkansas woman writes: "Have you noticed how jubilant the press of Arkansas is over the dignity that the legislature has conferred upon the women of that state by giving them the right to vote in Primary elections?
