

# THE LATEST NEWS.

## Review of the Work of the XLIXth Congress.

WASHINGTON, March 4.-Despite the fact that a very great deal of time has been consumed in useless debate, a review of the work done by the Forty-ninth congress, which expired sale by June 1st. Mr. Kidd says he to-day, discloses the fact that much has been accomplished in the way of enactment of general laws. Never were there so many bills introduced and more were reported from committees than at any previous congress. More too are left on the calendars as blasted hopes than was ever known at the expiration of congress. There were introduced in the house of representatives during the session just ended 11,259 bills and 263 joint resolutions. The last bill was introduced by Mr. Herbert of Alabama, and was for the payment of a private claim, while the last joint resolution was presented by Mr. Timothy Campbell, of Brooklyn. Of these measures introduced, 4,173 were reported back from the various committees with favorable or adverse recommendation, and a majority of them have died so far as having any legislative status is concerned. If they are to have any life in future congress they must be re-introduced. The last committee report was submitted by Mr. Breckenridge, of Kentucky, and was on the bill proposing to admit, duty free, materials to be used in rebuilding Eastport, Maine, which was destroved by fire.

There were introduced in the senate 3,357 bills, and 116 joint resolutions, and the per cent. reported from committees was a little higher than in the house. The last bill intro- Two centenarians died in Lowell,

CHICAGO, March 3 .- A special from Des Moines, Iowa, says George W. Kid, of New York, owner of the International distillery here, has issued orders to the superinteneent to stop buying grain, and to see that the amount on hand is disposed of either by consumption or will close the distillery at that time and not attempt to operate it further under prohibition laws. This closes the last distillery in Iowa.
