THE LATEST NEWS.

WAR IN KANSAS.

Citizens of the Two Towns of Coronado and Leoti, Armed to the Teeth, Prepared For a Repetition of Sunday's Tragedy.

WALLACE, Kan., March 7.—The situation in the Coronado-Leoti war remains unchanged. Both towns are surrounded by a strong cordon of armed men, who challenge every comer.

The country surrounding is as excited as the towns, and equally divided. Coronado sympathizers are for the most part in town with their ammunition and guns.

Immediately after the shooting, Sunday, some men from Leoti came to Wallace and secured all the guns and ammunition they could get.

County Sheriff John Edwards, who is a Leoti man, has not made an attempt to arrest the murderers.

The fatal difficulty that has placed Coronado in a state of siege occurred as follows: Charlie Coulter and Bill Raines, the ring-leaders of the Leoti crowd, went over to Coronado on Sunday morning and drank considerable beer and whisky.

FROM WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, March 7.—The State department has received a dispatch announcing the death of Consul General Heap at Constantinople.

President Cleveland will be fifty years old on Friday the 13th inst. He has not yet decided whether to make any special occasion of that date.

On next Monday the Danville system will put on an additional fast mail train (connecting with the train that leaves New York at 4.30 a. m.) between Washington, Atlanta, Ga., thence by Lynchburg, Va., and thence to New Orleans.

This train will connect with the fast mail on the Coast Line from New York to Jacksonville and will make direct connection from New York for all points throughout the Southern and South-western States.

Hints and Recipes.
