Evansville, Ind., Mareh 9.-The residents of Princeton and vicinity are much exercised over a phenomA severe rain storm beran before day break, and when the citizens

the depth of an ineh with a yellow substance. The doctors and chemists have examined it, but vary in their
conelusions. Nearly all agree, however, that it is a vegetable formation of some kind. Portions of it were sent to a scientist at Indianapolis for
analysis. Frank Bayer made a par tial analysis and says:
"The substanc possesses many of
the characteristics of sulpher, It is of a pale yellow color, insoluble in water o alcohol, but fully soluble in oil or turhaving a small quantity I could not make a fuller test. When allowed to crystal-
lize out of a solution of bi-sulphide of ize out of a solution of bi-sulphide of
carbon and placed under a miscroscope,
it is found to consist of small round bodit is found to consist of small round bod-
ies, which, magnified thirty diameters, have the appearance of mustard seeds,
and differ from ordinary flour sulphur. "It is probably of volcanic origin and
